



Guidelines and application form for RSUC master study scholarships

NORENSE invites qualified Nordic applicants to the Rudolf Steiner University College Master programme¹ to apply for scholarships covering tuition fees.

The purpose of the NORENSE funding is to support research, development projects and academic publications aimed at deepening or in other ways developing the theoretical and/or practical aspects of Steiner Waldorf education.

NORENSE especially welcomes projects that can build bridges between Steiner Waldorf education and mainstream schools/preschools and educational research.

All funded projects should be documented and reported in a form accessible to the intended public (teachers, researchers, or the public at large). Usually, in addition to the publication of a thesis or research papers in peer-reviewed journals, the project should be made publicly available as an article in a relevant popular or professional journal.

Applications should be addressed to NORENSE, and sent to the Research Director in digital form. Applications must include the following documents, all written in English.

- A completed Application Form.
- A 1-3 pages motivation letter with a description of the intended master thesis project:
 - CV with information about previous education and professional qualifications and experience.
 - Purpose and aim of taking a master degree; why do you want to undertake this study and what do you want to achieve with it.
 - A description of what benefits your workplace and also the Waldorf Steiner educational movement could get from your master thesis.
 - Time schedule for the study.
 - Short description of the need for economic support, and reasons why other available forms of funding were not attained.
- A recommendation letter from current or previous workplace confirming the value of undertaking a master study and the chosen theme for the thesis.

The maximum amount to be applied for is the total sum of the tuition fees at the RSUC Master programme. Scholarship payments will be transferred yearly.

Only applicants working or having worked in a Nordic Waldorf Steiner educational institution will be taken into account. Recipients of scholarships are expected to follow the

chosen study course of the programme, and the scholarship will be transformed into a loan if the receiving student leaves the programme before its completion.

Applications can be submitted anytime, but are reviewed only once a year in March.

Deadline is 15th of March.
